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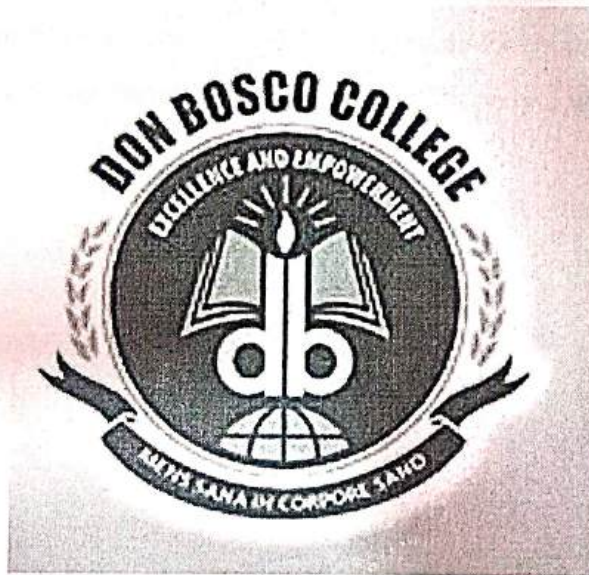

- ✚ To understand the training and capacity-building programs for healthcare workers involved in emergency mental health services.

Report

On 10th January 2025, I, a student of the Master of Social Work (MSW) program from Don Bosco College, Dharmapuri, Tamil Nadu, had the privilege of visiting the Government Hospital in Krishnagiri, Tamil Nadu. The visit was aimed at gaining an in-depth understanding of the Emergency Care and Recovery Center and its role in addressing the needs of individuals with mental illnesses, intellectual disabilities, and other psychiatric conditions.

The facility plays a pivotal role in providing immediate emergency medical care and long-term rehabilitation for patients, including those suffering from severe mental health disorders, which are often underrepresented in rural health systems. This hospital is supported by the Tamil Nadu Health Department, the National Health Mission, the Institute of Mental Health in Madras, the Rural Development Council, and other organizations such as The Banyan Academy of Leadership in Mental Health.

Through this visit, students had the opportunity to learn about various aspects of emergency care and recovery services in a public health setting and the importance of mental health support systems in rural areas.

Activities Undertaken

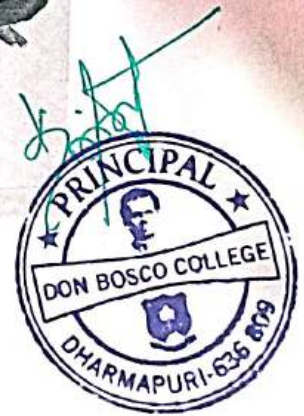
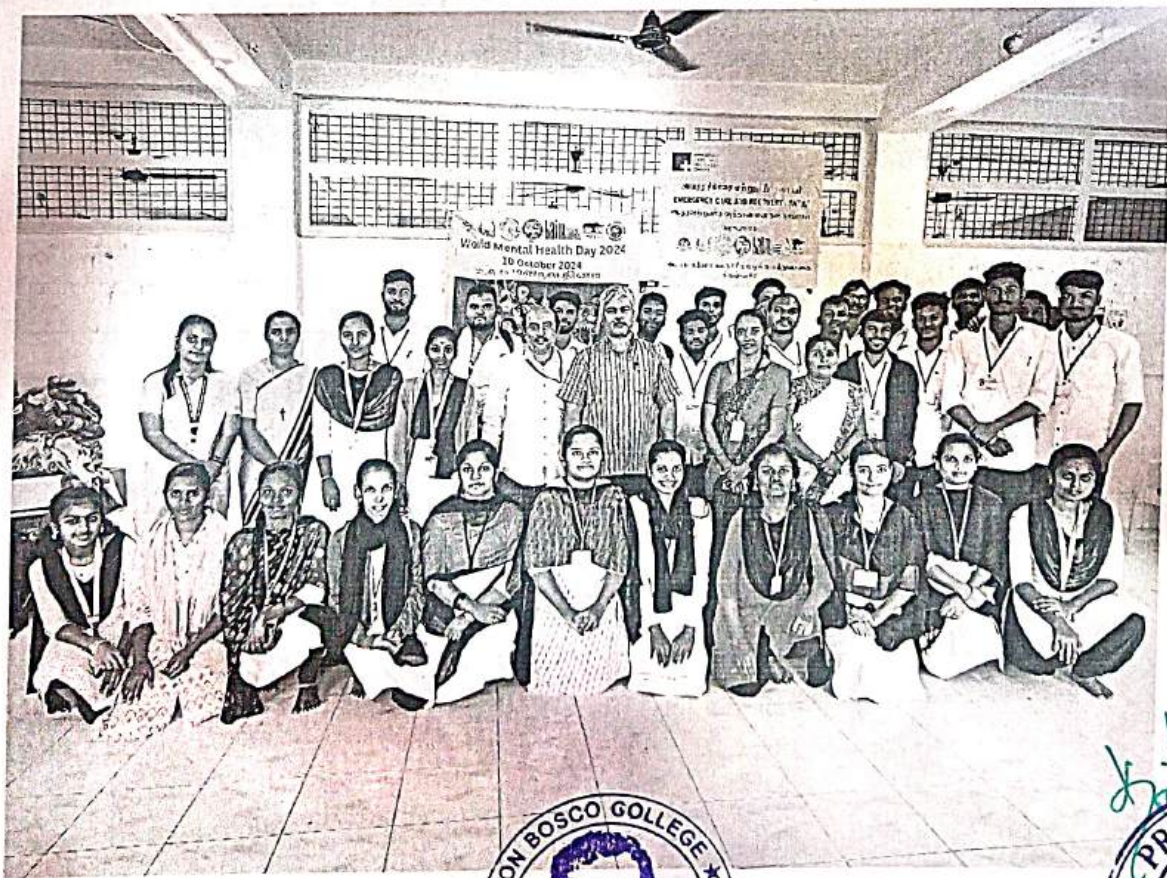
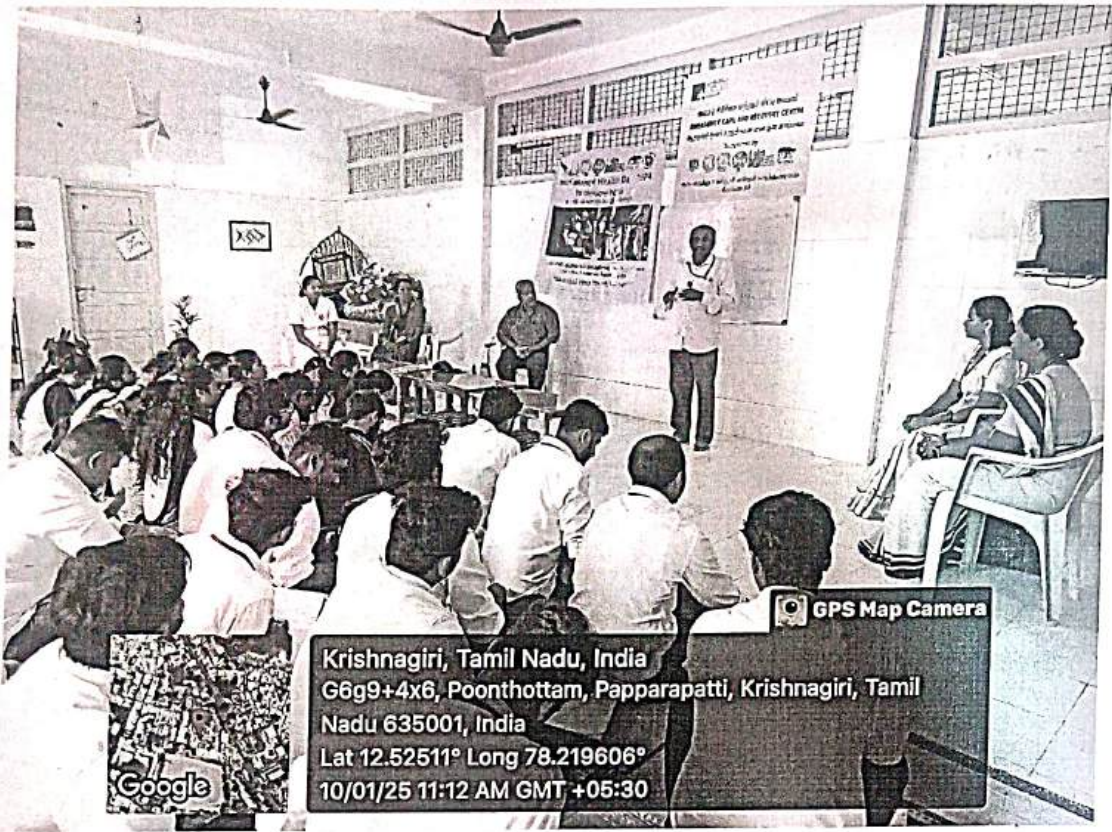
- ❖ Attended an orientation session on the working of the Emergency Care and Recovery Center.

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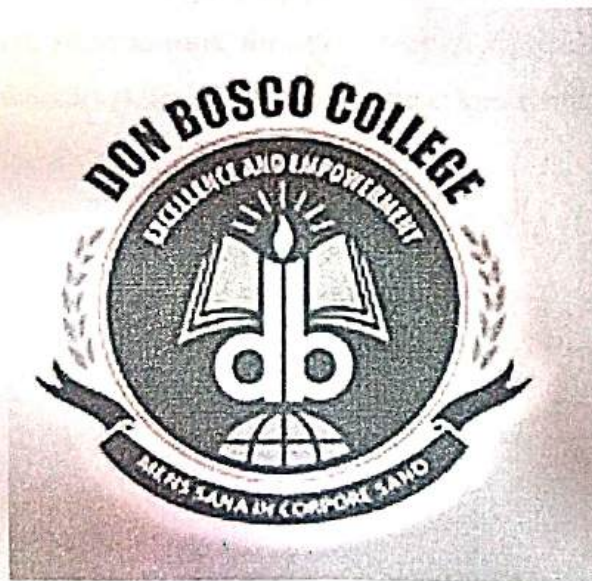

- Follow up

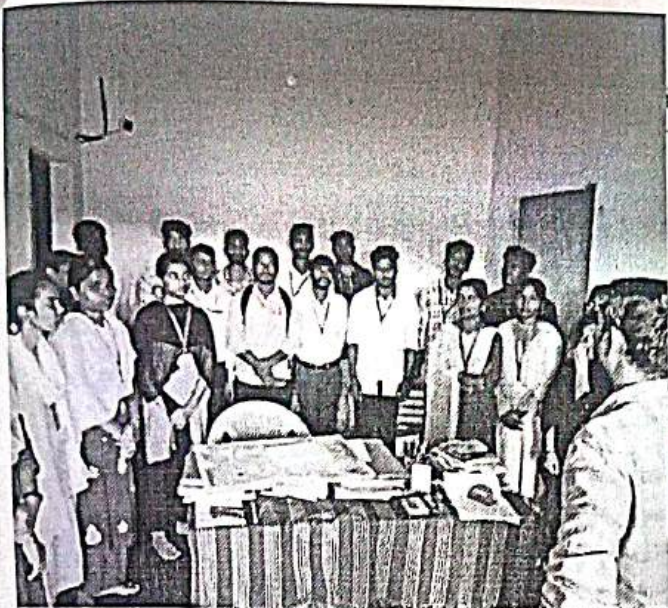

LEARNING OUTCOMES

- **Social work methods:** Trainees had learnt how trainees can apply social work methods in practice.
- **Group living:** Trainees have also learnt lots of experience in group living and had learnt to appreciate its value.

PARTICIPATORY RURAL APPRAISEL(PRA)

Participatory learning is a method of mapping and doing micro planning of any community. As far as rural development in concern, probably the PRA is being used for Social Resource mapping and transect walk, Some of the tools of PRA have been used that is,

- Social Mapping
- Resource Mapping
- Transect Walk
- Meeting with the villagers

SOCIAL MAPPING

Social mapping is a very important tool of PRA. The faculty members has introduced about the PRA and given importance of social mapping. With the help of villagers, students and faculty members had decided the place for drawing the social map of the Adaikalapuram Village.

RESOURCE MAPPING

At the stage of planning of practice, a source mapping has carried on the Adaikalapuram village in order to complete information needed for providing information and services to the villagers. Such a mapping explores the number and types of services available and provided by the social work trainee students as trainees as individuals to meet a particular need.

As trainees know that, the Rural Camp is a part and parcel of the social work education. For sustainable development of Adaikalapuram Village student social work educators. Resource mapping is a very important tool of PRA. For any community development for the natural and physical resource management plays very important role. Mapping process was supported detail discussion like total land, irrigation, pattern situation of water shed, cropping pattern, land ownership, cultivation area, annual rainfall, water resource for drinking and agriculture.

Nature of agricultural production, availability of market production, yearly income families.

MEETING THE VILLAGERS

In this meeting the team had conversation with the village people. During the discussion various points raised based on the observation done by the students and faculty of Don Bosco College and villagers also contributed in this discussion with their experience. With the discussion various problems and intervention areas taineesre came up like internal village road facility is poor, irrigation facilities, water shade work needed, school needed more development from 1st to 5th standard in their village. Problem of drinking water supply and quantity supplied insufficient.



Report

Contemporary Social Work practice is increasingly becoming complex and challenging social workers are engaged in working with society's most vulnerable, disadvantaged and deprived sections of the population who require help with the multiple needs. The situation and needs requiring social work intervention could be intra-personal, Inter-personal, inter-group or inter-organizational.

The model curriculum of the social work stipulates that the Rural Camp is a mandatory component of the Master's degree in the social work.

Every year the department of the social work PG of the Don Bosco College, Dharmapuri conducts a one trainees seek rural camp for the students of social work department for their 1st year students. This year's Rural Camp was been held at Adaikalapuram Village Krishnagiri District from 16th September to 21st September 2024.

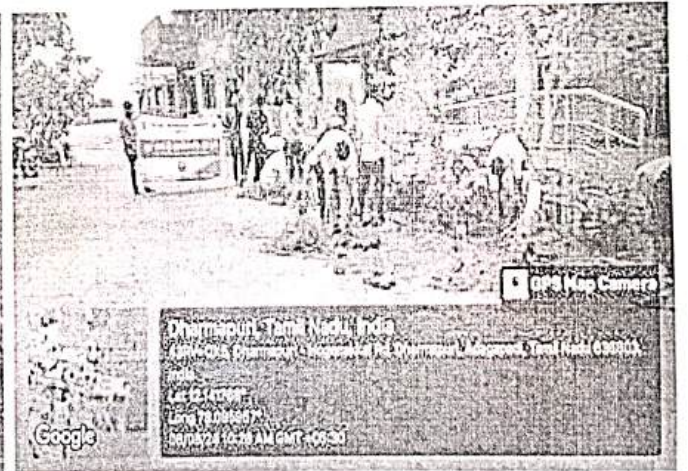
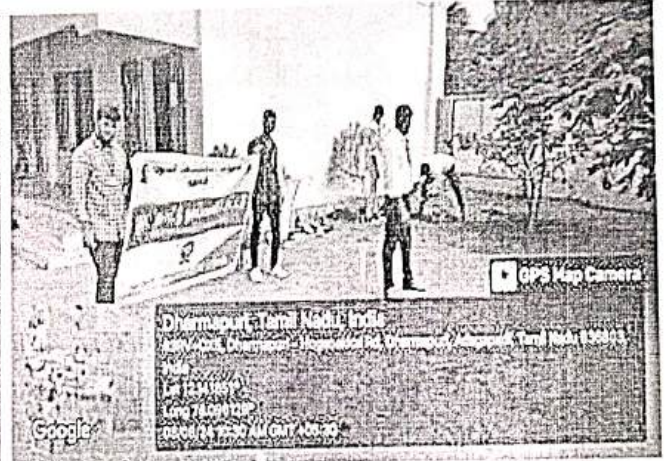
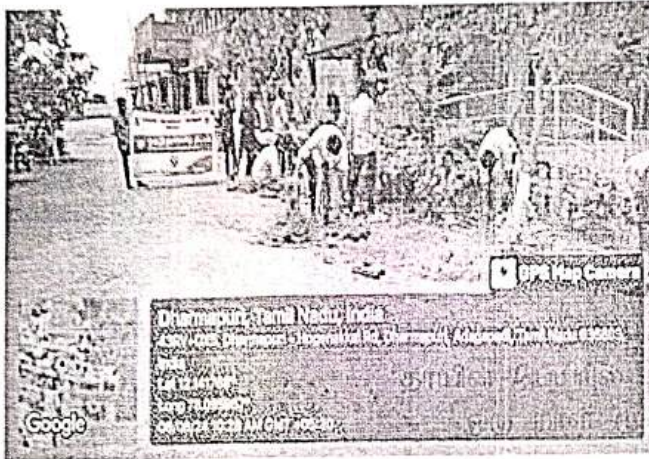
