- But to researcher, hypothesis means, a formal question that he intends to resolve.
- "A hypothesis is a tentative generalization, the validity which remains to be tested"-George A. Lund burg
- "A proposition which can be put in to test to determine validity"- Goode and Hatt

Characteristics of useful hypothesis:

The entire hypotheses which are developed by the researcher can not be used.

- Conceptual clearance
- Specific
- It should be related to available techniques
- Related to body of theory
- Simple and brief

Importance of Hypothesis

- It provide directions to the researcher
 - It is a guide to, the thinking process and the process of research
- It focuses research
- It prevents blind research
- It places clean and specific goals
- It is used to understand the problem clearly and formulate the procedures and methods to solve the problem.
- It serves as a frame work for drawing conclusion

- Lake of knowledge of scientific methods



The eye is the most precious organ of a human body and donating it, is even more beautiful. Eye donation can be done by dead person only. With this act of charity corneal blinds can be benefit. Cornea is the soft and transparent tissue, can be used to restore vision to corneal blinds.

Corneal blindness is when; the cornea of the eye becomes cloudy. It is a focusing element of the eye and when this is affected is called corneal blindness. This can happen due to accidents, scratches by sharp objects, chemical burns, flying debris or road accidents, infections and malnutrition.

The eye can be donated after death. A person wishing to donate eyes should make close family members aware of their intentions. It can be successfully completed by approaching authorities of eye banks.

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


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



The trainee ended the day with lots of learning and gained lot of information about the basic skills of HR manager with the help of Sridhar the Resource Person.



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

Nocebo effect

When a patient anticipates a side effect of a medication, then they suffer that effect even if the medication is actually an inert substance.

Sub-conscious mind

The sub-conscious mind defines all reactions and automatic actions. We become aware of what we think about them, eg-our ability to drive a car, once we get skilled we stop thinking which way to ride, which pedal to use, yet aware of what was done once we think about it.

Unconscious mind

Defines all past events and memories, inaccessible to us no matter how hard we try to remember to bring it up.

Conscious mind

Defines all thoughts and action within our awareness






CONCLUSION:
