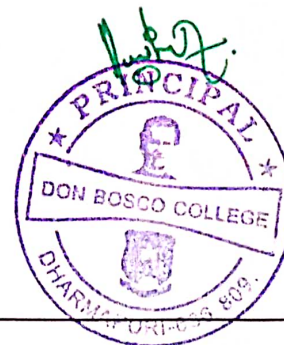

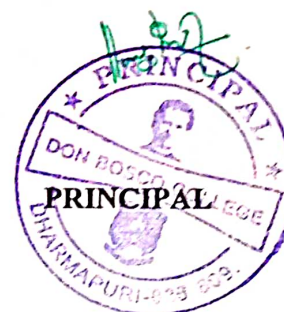

Activities Undertaken:

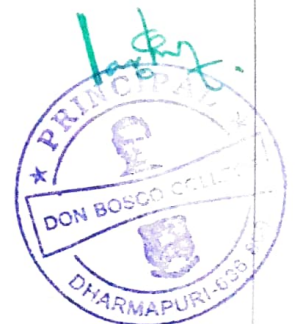
- 1) Staff briefs about the patients' condition.

DAY: 1

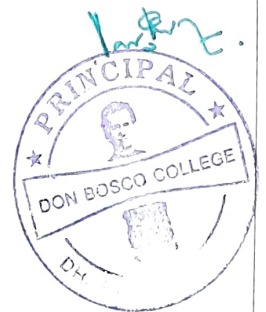
10.09.2017 – (Sunday)

DAY: 4

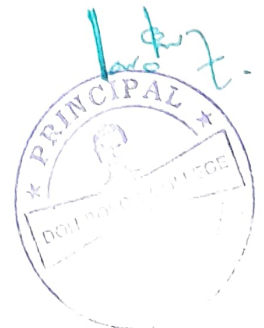
13.09.2017 - (Wednesday)

DAY: 5

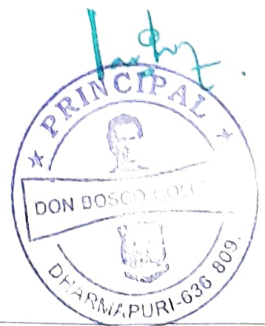
14.09.2017 - (Thursday)
